The Ultimate Succulent Club™

Zone: 10 (30°F)

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- Chunky, triangular leaves with a rough texture stack up on stems up to 6" tall
- Charming flower clusters bloom late winter to spring with clumps of lots of tiny, pale pink blossoms
- Drought tolerant and thrives in very gritty soil with infrequent, deep watering only when the soil is dry and the leaves feel less firm

and vibrant

- Bella Rouge Echeveria
- Neat green and red rosette that has distinct lines like its E. nodulosa parent
- Sun lover that thrives on sunny windowsills where it can grow compact and vibrant
- Water infrequently and only when the soil is completely dry and the leaves feel less firm

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Morning Beauty Echeveria

- Pale blue leaves verging on white that get a rosy pink blush at their edges when grown in bright sun
- **Compact rosette** that stays under 4.0" wide but is packed with wide leaves
- Hybrid of mysterious origins; possibly a naturally occurring form of E. peacockii or a cross of E. cante x E. shaviana
- Sun lover that tolerates drought; only water when soil is completely dry and leaves start to feel less firm

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






Pink Edge Echeveria runyonii

- Classic beauty with an ivory base color that blushes pink when gently stressed with full sun and drought
- Sun loving plant that thrives in full sun on a south facing window sill or outdoors in frost-free weather
- Powdery coating of farina protects the leaves in full sun and gives them a matte finish
- Tolerates neglect well and can easily go weeks without water



Kalanchoe hildebrandtii var. glabra

- Robust, stemmed succulent that's easy to grow and adds height to arrangements
- Rounded, green leaves are thick, waxy, and slightly cupped
- Native to Madagascar where it can grow over 3' tall
- Adds height to arrangements and can grow tall silvery stems

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Ed Storms Haworthia

- Loose rosette of green leaves that can flush reddish when gently stressed by direct sun
- Long, narrow foliage has flattened leaf tips that are speckled with white flecks
- Translucent leaf tips help the plant absorb more sunlight, even when grown indoors
- Easy house plant that thrives with rocky soil, neglect, and deep but infrequent water

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Elephant Food Portulacaria macrophylla

1821)

- Round, apple green leaves contrast with flexible red to purple stems
- Long, branching stems spread over the ground in frost-free climates or overflow from indoor containers
- Easy to grow variety that thrives with rapid drainage, bright sun, and deep, infrequent water
- Stands out in container arrangements, contrasting with the color and form of other succulents

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Aureum Sedum acre

- Outdoor succulent that makes an easy groundcover that tolerates temperatures down to -30F (Zone 4)
- Spreading groundcover of short green stems covered with tiny leaves; moss-like appearance
- A sea of yellow flowers blooms through summer and attracts pollinators

Zone: 4 (-30°F) The Ultimate Succulent Club™ Pink Butterflies Kalanchoe x houghtonii

- Variegated form of K. x houghtonii that develops bubblegum pink highlights when grown in full sun
- Mini, pink plantlets sprout from its leaf edges and fall off to re-root and grow into more Pink Butterflies
- Vigorous grower that can develop tall, branching stems; good choice for succulent beginners

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
