







Burrito

Sedum burrito

- Vigorous trailing variety that can grow stems up to 3¹ long covered with bean-like leaves
- Naturally occurring species from Mexico, well-loved in cultivation but, as yet, undiscovered in the wild
- Quick to propagate from stem cuttings or leaves (an advantage, since its leaves fall off easily)
- Tolerates drought, full sun, and neglect, needing only great drainage and protection from frost

Orange Delight

Sedum nussbaumerianum

- Sun-loving stemmed rosette with chunky leaves and a robust growth habit
- Vibrant tones of lime, yellow, and orange with the brightest colors resulting from drought and direct sun
- Blooms each summer with clusters of white, star-shaped flowers with a light fragrance
- Freely branching form that can cascade from containers and easily re-roots from stem cuttings

Jet Beads

Sedeveria

- Distinctively shaped succulent with short stems covered by chunky, teardrop leaves
- Dark coloration of green and burgundy that deepens to near black in full sun and drought
- Contrasts well with most succulents in arrangements, both due to its unique form and coloration
- Easy to propagate from stem cuttings or fallen leaves by planting into damp, gritty soil

Mini Me

Sedum rubrotinctum

- Dwarf Jelly Bean variety with tiny, round leaves lining its short stems
- Red to copper flushes on leaf tips with exposure to direct sun
- Charming, slow grower stays small in pots or spreads as a ground cover outdoors in frost-free climates
- Easy to propagate from stem cuttings or leaves when transplanted into pots with drainage holes and gritty soil

Blue Burrito

Sedeveria

- Large, robust grower with long stems and a full covering of slender, pointed leaves
- Icy, silver color can transition to more blue or pink tones, depending on how much sunlight it gets
- Great for arrangements thanks to its large size and trailing habit, which adds levels to a planting
- Easy to re-root and propagate from stem cuttings and mature leaves; perfect for sharing!

California Sunset

Graptosedum

- Range of pink, orange, and purple tones, with deeper colors when stressed by sun, drought, or cool temperatures
- Intrageneric hybrid of Ghost Plant (Graptopetalum paraguayense) and Sedum adolphii
- Fast, forgiving grower when given great drainage; can spill from containers for a bountiful, sprawling effect
- Easy to prune and propagate from stem cuttings or mature leaves to maintain a more compact look

Pink Granite

Sedeveria

- Soft pink leaves and a pastel green center, with the brightest hues when grown in full sun
- Stemmed grower that can reach 6.0" tall and gently spill from containers
- **Grows offsets at base** and readily re-roots from stem cuttings
- Easy to grow in pots with drainage holes and gritty soil; protect from frost and water deeply when soil is completely dry

Frank Venz

Pachysedum

- Long, faceted leaves sprout upwards from tall stems and give a crystalline look
- Orange highlights in response to full sun accent the verdant green base coloration
- Tall "thriller" in container arrangements that combines well with shorter and trailing plants
- Sun lover that only needs occasional water when soil is completely dry and leaves feel less firm

Blue Jelly Bean

Sedum pachyphyllum

- Chunky, finger-like leaves sprout upwards from tall stems that can reach 12.0" tall or be pruned short
- Blue-green tones are the norm, but a rosy blush appears at the leaf tips when grown in full sun
- Cheery yellow blooms appear clustered on tall flower stalks in spring and summer
- Low maintenance plant that can go long stretches without water and thrives in well-draining pots and soil

Salsa

Sedum

- Spunky plant with jellybean-like leaves that curve upward and show light facets
- Bright red leaf tips accent the minty green foliage and deepen with full sun and drought
- Tall, branching stems up to 8" long can bend and spill out of containers
- Tolerates long droughts and rocky soil because its chunky leaves can store lots of water

Golden Glow

Sedum x adolphii

- Vibrant succulent that shifts between yellow, orange, and near red tones depending on its sun exposure
- Long, slender leaves come to a sharp point and show distinct color outlines at their margins
- Strong grower that spreads well outdoors in frost-free weather and thrive indoors on a sunny sill
- Easy to propagate and re-root from stem cuttings and mature leaves
