



ET's Fingers Jade

Crassula ovata

- **Tubular, spoon-shaped foliage** makes this genetic sport distinctive from typical jade plants
- **Green leaves can show yellow and red tips** when gently stressed by drought and direct sun
- **No-fuss houseplant** that looks great even with minimal light and water; be sure to use well-draining pots and soil
- **Branching stems** can turn woody over time and lend themselves to bonsai pruning

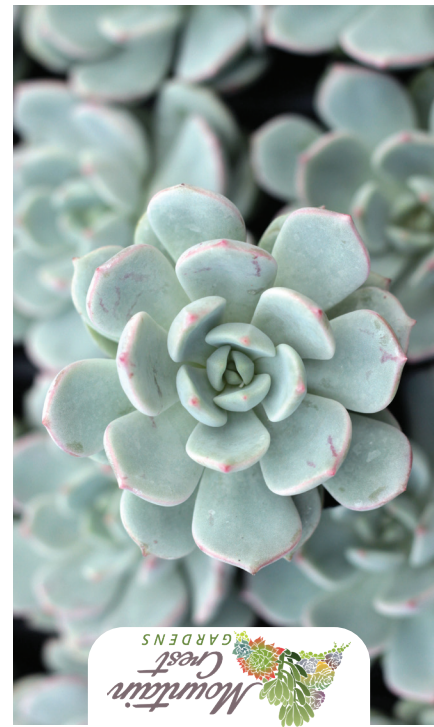
Orion

Echeveria

- **Pearlescent, pastel rosette** that can shift between silvery blue and soft lilac tones
- **Low, open form** up to 6.0" wide and under 3.0" tall, with lots of round, cupped leaves
- **Sun-loving, Dutch hybrid** of *E. lilacina* × *E. pulidonis* that grows well in pots with drainage holes and light, gritty soil
- **Solitary grower** that rarely produces offsets but can propagate from mature, healthy leaves

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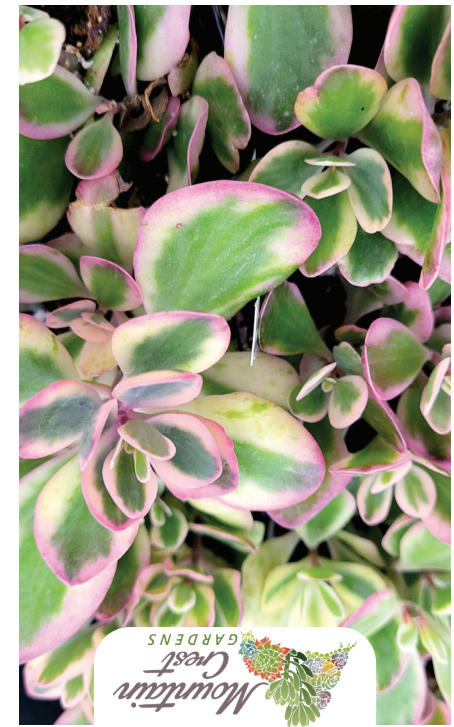
Moonglow

Echeveria

- **Pastel rosette** of thick, wide leaves that make for a cute, chonky appearance
- **Pale silver to green foliage** blushes a rosy pink when gradually stressed by direct sun and drought
- **Sun-lover** that thrives on a south-facing sill, under a grow light, or outdoors in frost-free weather
- **Powdery farina** and thick leaves make this variety well-adapted to sunny, arid conditions

Zone: 10 (30°F)

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Aurora Borealis

Kalanchoe fedtschenkoi f. variegata

- **Variegated beauty** with big, scalloped foliage of green, pink, and cream
- **Large, quickly growing succulent** that can grow a stem up to 12" tall
- **Beautiful blooms** of clusters of small, orange flowers
- **Easy to grow** on sunny sills or outdoors in frost-free weather and propagates readily from stem cuttings

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Hobbit Jade

Crassula ovata

Zone: 9 (20°F)

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Haworthia cooperi var. *truncata*

- A **juicy, bubbly looking plant** that forms tight clumps of round, fleshy leaves
- **Translucent leaves** help the plant absorb more sunlight but they also give it a jelly-like appearance
- **Small, slow grower** that can eventually produce clusters of offsets with proper care
- **Grows well indoors in part sun** with extra gritty soil; drench deeply when the soil's dry and the leaves feel less firm

Zone: 10 (30°F)

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
