



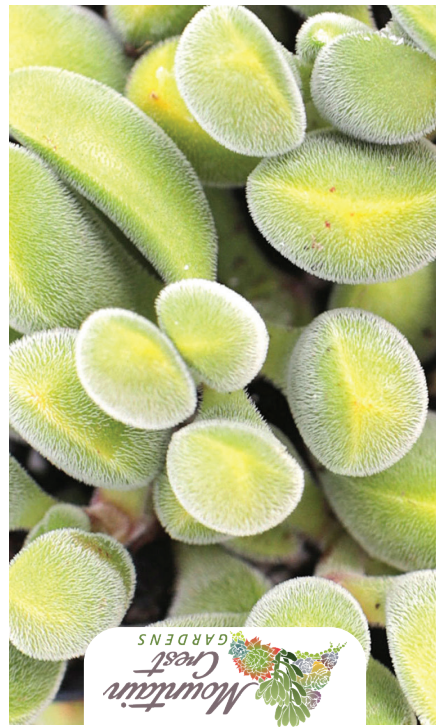
String of Pearls

Senecio rowleyanus

- Phenomenal trailing succulent with slender, string-like stems that can grow up to 3.0' long
- Round leaves that resemble green peas line the stems and have a crescent of translucent "leaf window" to let sunlight in
- Stylish houseplant that grows into an eye-catching cascade when planted in a hanging pot near a sunny window
- Thrives in gritty soil but likes more frequent water than most succulents (when soil is dry and the leaves start to wrinkle)

Crassula rogersii

Crassula Rogersii

- Soft, velvety plant with chunky, green leaves that grow in upright pairs along each stem
- Branching sub-shrub that can reach 1.0' tall when given bright, indirect light, gritty soil, and deep, infrequent water
- Blushes red to orange sunset tones when gently stressed by direct sun and drought
- Can bloom mid-summer to fall with clusters of tiny, pale-yellow blossoms

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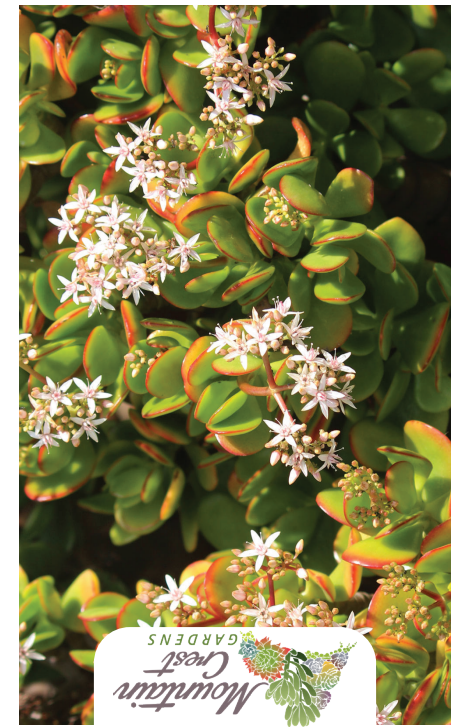
Calico Kitten

Crassula pellucida f. variegata

- Heart-shaped leaves are stacked on long, narrow stems that arch downward as they grow
- Variegation of pink, mint, and cream makes for a charming color scheme that becomes more vibrant when grown in bright sun
- Great choice for hanging baskets or to spill out of containers; re-roots readily from stem cuttings
- Thrive in sunny windows or partial outdoor sun with well-draining pots and soil

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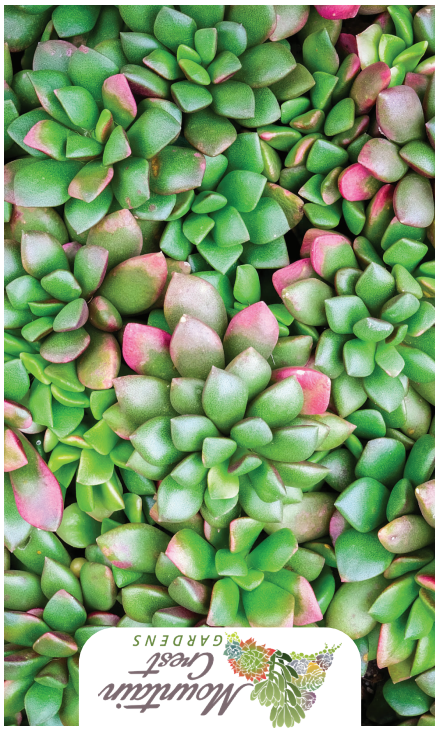
Baby Jade

Crassula ovata

- Round, glossy leaves flush red at the edges when exposed to direct sun
- Versatile plant that can grow outdoors (zone 9+) as a large, landscaping shrub or indoors where it will stay petite
- Robust and easy to grow when given rapid drainage, bright sun, and deep, infrequent water
- Fun and simple to propagate stem cuttings: let cuttings dry 3-5 days then plant in well-draining soil

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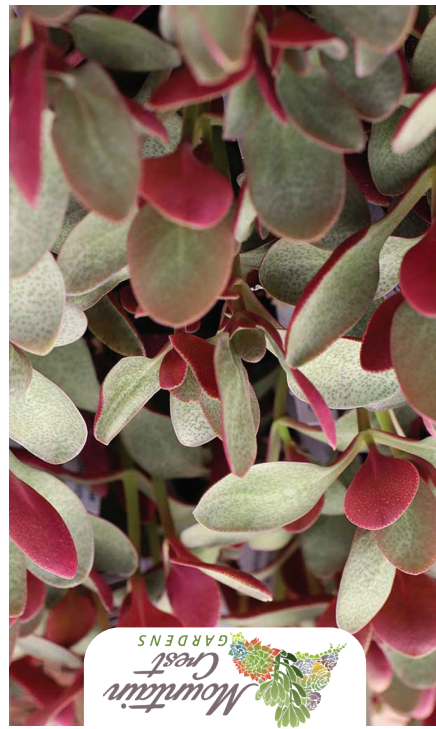
Sand Rose

Anacampseros rufescens

- A colorful, clumping rosette with white hairs along its stem and bicolor leaves of olive green and burgundy
- Native to South Africa where it spreads in rocky shrublands, eventually forming a dense mat
- Showy blooms with large, magenta petals appear in spring to summer growing season
- Tolerates more frequent water than most succulents, wrinkling its leaves when it's ready for a drenching

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Fairy Crassula

Crassula multicava

- Large leaved stem succulent with broad, round leaves dotted with freckles
- Multicolor foliage is green on top and berry red beneath
- Tolerates a little more water than other succulents due to its thin leaves
- Thrives in bright sun and propagates readily from stem cuttings

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Small Red Carpet

Crassula pubescens ssp. radicans

- Easy to grow mini shrublet that has spreading branches and small, oval leaves
- Bright red pigments flush when grown in direct sunlight and watered infrequently
- Cluster of small white flowers when it blooms in winter to early spring
- Propagates readily from stem cuttings, making it easy to share

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
