







Pink Jelly Bean

Sedum rubrotinctum

- Chimera of regular Jelly Beans (aka 'Aurora') that blushes rose to coral pink in direct sun
- Chunky, bean-shaped leaves spiral up stems that can grow about 6.0" tall
- Fast, easy grower when given lots of sunshine and deep (but infrequent) water
- Leaves fall off easily but can readily take root; quick to propagate from stem cuttings

Perle von Nurnberg

Echeveria

- Classic, resilient hybrid of E. 'Metallica' × E. elegans that has been a favorite since the 1930s
- Vibrant gradients of purple, pink, and sage green make it an eye-catching plant in arrangements
- Elegant, spathulate leaves are coated with a powdery wax that helps them tolerate full sun
- Strong, relatively fast grower that produces few offsets but propagates readily from leaves

Ghost Plant

Graptopetalum paraguayense

- One of the most popular succulents due to its stunning coloration and easy cultivation
- Rosette of long, flat leaves grow on long stems that can bend and trail elegantly from a container
- Pearlescent tones of pink, blue, and silver give this plant its second common name:
 Mother of Pearl Plant
- Likely native to sunny, rocky mountains of Mexico (not Paraguay), though it has yet to be re-discovered in the wild

Fleur Blanc

Echeveria

- Classic rose-shaped succulent with powder blue foliage and delicately pointed tips
- Rose pink highlights blush at the leaf edges when moderately stressed by direct sun and drought
- Powdery farina (epicuticular wax) helps this plant tolerate arid conditions and gives it a matte finish
- **Easy windowsill plant** that thrives with full sun, drought, rocky soil, and deep but infrequent water

Zone: 10 (30°F)

Alpenglow Graptosedum

- Soft rose to deep coral leaves resemble the colors of snowy mountains at sunset
- Tall stems can grow up to 8" long but maintain a full covering of miniature leaves
- Full sun and drought tolerant but needs protection from frost, e.g. indoors near a sunny window
- Grows quickly and roots readily from stem cuttings; just prune and re-plant in gritty, well-draining soil
