







Jelly Bean Sedum rubrotinctum

- Fun, stemmed succulent covered with tiny, bead-like leaves that flush red in direct sun
- Chunky, bean-shaped leaves spiral up stems that can grow about 6.0" tall
- Fast, easy grower when given lots of sunshine and deep (but infrequent) water
- Leaves fall off easily but can readily take root; quick to propagate from stem cuttings

S. clavatum

- Sweet, pastel rosette that can grow robust stems up to 8.0" long, which sprawl and spill out of pots
- Blue-green color shifts to pink with increased light and a thick coating of farina gives a matte, powdery finish
- Naturally occurring species native to the andesite cliffsides of Mexico's Tiscalatengo River
- A striking feature in hanging baskets, particularly when gently stressed by direct sun and drought

Lola Echeveria

- Classic beauty that's been popular for decades for its pearlescent coloration and vigor
- Sun loving plant that thrives in full sun on a south facing window sill or outdoors in frost-free weather
- **Powdery coating of farina** protects the leaves in full sun and gives them a matte finish
- Tolerates neglect well and can easily go weeks without water; drench deeply when soil is completely dry and leaves feel less turgid

Little Warty Gasteria

- Outstanding indoor plant that thrives with less sunlight and water than most succulents can tolerate
- Tongue-shaped leaves are striped with light green and textured with lots of tiny bumps
- Forgiving grower that tolerates neglect, drought, low light, full sun, small pots, and black thumbs
- Sprouts a tall bloom stalk from which hang numerous coral, tubular flowers that delight hummingbirds

H. retusa f. geraldii Haworthia retusa f. geraldii

- Recurved leaves bend back to expose translucent, triangular leaf tips to as much sun as possible
- Bronze to yellow tones expressed when the plant is stressed by drought and direct sun
- **Prolific offsets** form around each plant's base; grows into a dense, mounded cluster
- Easy to grow indoors and thrives with deep watering when the soil is completely dry

Air Plant Tillandsia ionantha 'Fuego'

- Tropical epiphyte that grows anchored to jungle trees instead of out of the ground
- Thrives in high humidity or with regular dunkings or weekly, one hour water baths
- Easy houseplant that can be displayed in most bright rooms on non-porous surfaces like stones, glass, or shells
- Blooms once at the end of its life then produces clusters of new offsets at its base
