



Sempervivum dolomiticum x montanum

- **Spunky hybrid** of two wild species that makes a great garden plant for its vigor and prolificacy
- **Unique, spiky look** from extra narrow, pointed leaves that stand upright or curl inwards into a ball
- **Green rosettes** get bright red highlights at their leaf tips that spread and deepen to full burgundy through winter
- **Sprouts piles of “chicks”** or offsets on long, hot pink stolons, with the colony developing into a bumpy cluster

Zone: 5 (-30°F)

Sempervivum ciliosum

- **Frosty looking rosette** of green leaves covered with small, shimmery hairs
- **Dramatic red flushing** of leaf tips in full sun contrasts well with the lime green base tone
- **Stays small and low** to the ground but spreads outward with new offsets or “chicks”
- **Fast grower** that can quickly fill in crevices between stepping stones or in rock walls

Sempervivum arachnoideum ssp. tomentosum

- **Heavily webbed** with a covering of thick, white wool that helps the rosette tolerate full sun
- **Olive green base color** with a deep purple flushing that lasts winter through spring
- **Grows into a dense mat** of offsets that sprout from mother rosettes on hot pink stolons
- **Resilient grower** that tolerates full sun, drought, rocky soil, and deep frosts

Zone: 5 (-30°F)

Borealis Sedum morganianum

- **“Roller” variety** that sprouts rounded offsets which easily break off and roll away to root
- **Tolerates full sun and frost** by closing inward on itself in a tight, protected ball
- **Spreads readily** as a mounded mat tightly packed with miniature rosettes
- **Lime green foliage** can flush red to purple in response to stress from sun or cold temperatures

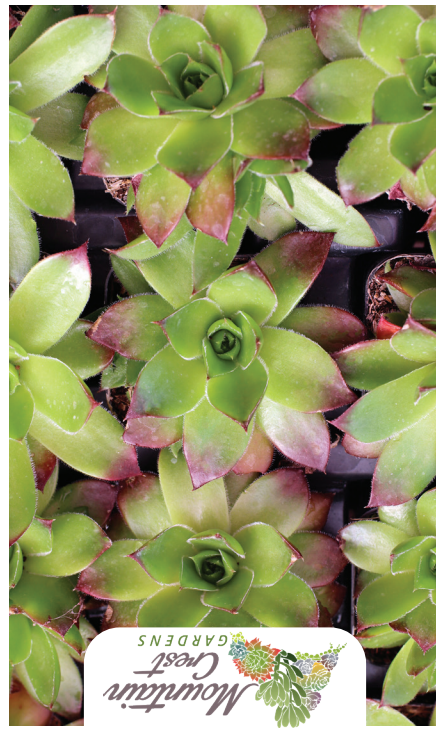
Chocolate Sundae

Sempervivum heuffelii

- Striking rosette of glossy leaves that flush brick red to carmine with full sun and cold nights
- Fringe of cilia line the foliage and highlight each leaf with bright white “lashes”
- Super frost hardy all the way down to -30F (Zone 4) and tolerates full sun and drought
- Self-propagates through “crown division” with new offsets emerging from within the mother rosette

Zone: 4 (-30°F)

Fandango

Sempervivum heuffelii

- One of the largest cultivars of *S. heuffelii* with its extra-long, broad, green leaves
- Bright, white cilia line the leaf margins and highlight the cheery foliage
- Grow in full, outdoor sun to get glossy, burgundy accents that deepen and spread in winter
- Drought tolerant plant for colorful, waterwise landscaping, even in hot summers and rocky soil

Zone: 4 (-30°F)
