







Donkey's Tail

Sedum morganianum

- Vigorous trailing variety that can grow stems up to 3¹ long covered with teardrop-shaped leaves
- Naturally occurring species from Mexico, well-loved in cultivation and only recently found in the wild
- Quick to propagate from stem cuttings or leaves (an advantage, since its leaves can fall off easily)
- Tolerates drought, full sun, and neglect, needing only great drainage and protection from frost

Zone: 10 (30°F)

S. Oaxacanum

Sedum Oaxacanum

- Silvery green succulent with a frosty look from a dusting of natural wax that protects it in full sun
- Small, rounded leaves cover the ends of its long, sprawling stems, which can bloom with yellow flowers
- Excellent for height in arrangements or for ground cover in warm climates (Zone 9+)
- Native to high elevations in Oaxaca,
 Mexico where it is adapted to tolerate short, light frosts

Zone: 9 (20°F)

Himalayan Skies

Sedum dasyphyllum

- Distinctive blue foliage grows in tight spirals along sprawling stems and contrast well with other plants
- Frost hardy outdoor plant for containers, ground cover, retaining walls, and rock gardens
- Charming white blossoms bloom in early summer to attract pollinators
- Thrives in full, outdoor sun and rocky, well-draining soil

Zone: 7 (0°F)

Trailing Jade

Senecio jacobsenii

- Robust stems and leaves make this a vigorous trailing plant that can withstand long droughts
- Oval leaves flush magenta when grown in direct sun, like a hanging pot in a window
- Native to Tanzania and Kenya where it grows as a ground cover
- Cascades up to 4 feet when grown in bright sun with deep but infrequent water

Zone: 10 (30°F)

C. schimperi

Crassula schimperi

- Stacked Crassula with stems covered with upturned, green leaves
- More sun makes the leaves stack more tightly, creating a neat column
- Branches into a shrublet and can be pruned and re-rooted from cuttings
- Easy indoor grower that can tolerate a bit lower light and bit more water than most succulents

Zone: 10 (30°F)

String of Tears

Senecio herreanus

- Phenomenal trailing succulent with slender, string-like stems that can grow over a foot long
- Teardrop-shaped leaves line green to purple stems and have a crescent of translucent "leaf window" to let sunlight in
- Stylish houseplant that grows into an eye-catching cascade when planted in a hanging pot near a sunny window
- Thrives in gritty soil but likes more frequent water than most succulents (when soil is dry and the leaves start to wrinkle)

Zone: 10 (30°F)
