

## String of Bananas

*Senecio radicans*

- **Easy, trailing succulent** that can grow an impressive cascade from a hanging pot in a sunny window
- **Banana or fishhook-like leaves** with a translucent “leaf window” line thin stems to 3’ or longer
- **Fast grower** when given lots of indirect sun, rapid drainage, and deep water when the soil is dry
- **Easy to propagate** from stem cuttings and will naturally sprout new roots along its stems

Zone: 10 (30°F)

## Chain Plant

*Callisia navicularis*

- **Easy houseplant** that grows sprawling masses of robust stems up to 12” long
- **Angular foliage** that resembles little boats is referenced by its specific epithet, “navicularis”
- **Green base tone** gets a speckling of purple when gently stressed with direct sun
- **Tolerates more frequent water** than most succulents due to its thin leaves, but still need rapid drainage

Zone: 9 (20°F)

## String of Pearls

*Senecio rowleyanus*

- **Phenomenal trailing succulent** with slender, string-like stems that can grow up to 3.0’ long
- **Round leaves** that resemble green peas line the stems and have a crescent of translucent “leaf window” to let sunlight in
- **Stylish houseplant** that grows into an eye-catching cascade when planted in a hanging pot near a sunny window
- **Thrives in gritty soil** but likes more frequent water than most (when soil is dry and the leaves start to wrinkle)

Zone: 10 (30°F)

## Blue Pickle Vine

*Senecio radicans* ‘Glaucua’

- **Glaucous blue leaves** are lined with fine pinstripes and curved like bananas
- **Prolific trailer** that can grow an impressive 3’ cascade from a hanging pot in a sunny window
- **Fast grower** when given lots of indirect sun, rapid drainage, and deep water when the soil is dry
- **Easy to propagate** from stem cuttings and will naturally sprout new roots along its stems

Zone: 10 (30°F)

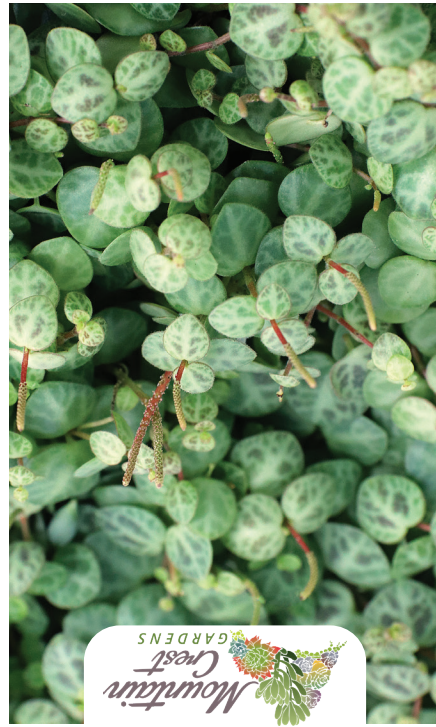
## Ruby Necklace

*Othonna capensis*

- **Colorful, trailing succulent** that turns from green to magenta then plum with increased sun exposure
- **Slender, purple stems** can grow 2' long and are covered with pudgy, bean-like leaves
- **Grows white tufts of fuzz** along its stem—don't worry, it's not mealybug!
- **Flourishes in south-facing windows** with deep drenchings when the soil is dry and the leaves just start to pucker

## String of Turtles

*Peperomia prostrata*

- **Adorable flat, round leaves** show patterns like green turtle backs when grown in lots of indirect sun
- **Grows piles of foliage** that sprawl and then form dense cascades of stems up to 12" long
- **Thrives in hanging pots** with light, well-draining soil kept near bright windows
- **Less vulnerable to rot** than most succulents due to its slender stems and thinner leaves

Zone: 10 (30°F)
