



Zebra Plant

Haworthiopsis fasciata

- **Popular house plant** for its raised, white striping and ability to tolerate low light conditions
- **Hard to kill** and rarely affected by common succulent pests and diseases when kept in rooms with good airflow
- **Low maintenance** and needs only occasional, deep soaking when the soil is completely dry
- **Protect from frost** and standing water by planting in containers with drainage holes and light, gritty soil

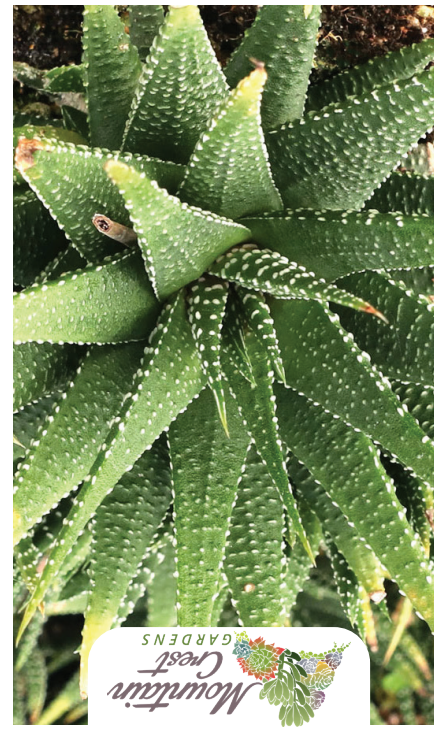


Cotyledon pendens

- **Stunning trailing plant** that can grow profuse, cascading stems over 12" long
- **Chunky, pistachio leaves** are teardrop shaped and coated with powdery farina
- **Bright sun** can bring out red highlights at the leaf tips
- **Charming coral flowers** dangle like bells and can attract hummingbirds

Haworthia attenuata

- **Popular house plant** for its raised, white striping and ability to tolerate low light conditions

Mother of Thousands

Kalanchoe laetevirens

- **Vigorous grower** that tolerates suboptimal conditions better than most succulents
- **Sprouts new plantlets** called bulbils along its leaves that can drop and re-root
- **Large, verdant leaves** have a triangular shape and tend to stand upright
- **Protect from frost** and grow in a well-draining pot to control spread

Orostachys spinosa f. minuta

- Frost hardy succulent native to Siberia that can tolerate temperatures down to -20F
- Rare, mini form with tightly packed clusters of blue green leaves
- Can grow outdoors in full sun or indoors on a very sunny windowsill
- Rosettes stay tiny, but can spread into wide mats

Zone: 5 (-20°F)

Tiger Tooth Aloe *Aloe Juvenna*

- Easy indoor plant that readily tolerates neglect, lower light, and drought
- Upright, green leaves show a nice pattern of light speckles and freckles
- Toothy foliage has light spines along its margins but is gentle to the touch
- Native to Kenya and blooms with red, tubular flowers on tall bloom stalks
