

Chocolate Soldier

Kalanchoe tomentosa

- Cinnamon brown cultivar of the much-loved Panda Plant from Madagascar
- Fuzzy, felt-like coating on leaves and stems helps plant tolerate dry, sunny conditions
- Low-maintenance house plant that stays tidy in containers and propagates readily from leaves
- Thrives with deep but infrequent water in well-draining pots and soil

Zone: 10 (30°F)

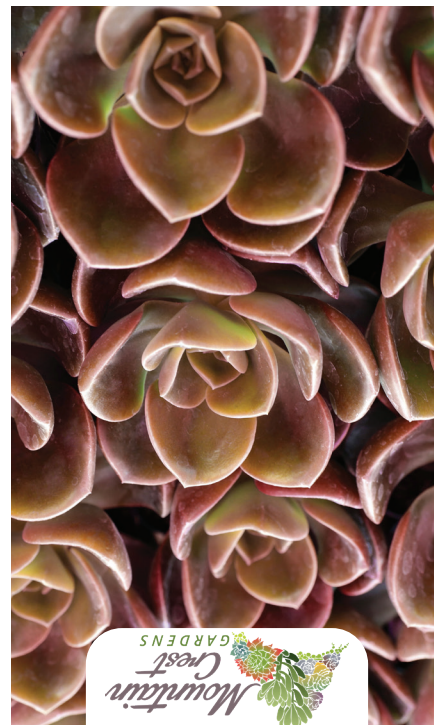
S. oaxacanum

Sedum oaxacanum

- Silvery green succulent with a frosty look from a dusting of natural wax that protects it in full sun
- Small, rounded leaves cover the ends of its long, sprawling stems, which can bloom with yellow flowers
- Excellent for height in arrangements or for ground cover in warm climates (Zone 9+)
- Native to high elevations in Oaxaca, Mexico where it is adapted to tolerate short, light frosts

Zone: 9 (20°F)

Melaco

Echeveria

- Unique color gradient from a sea green center to chocolate brown with salmon pink leaf margins
- Named after “molasses” in Portuguese for the rich, dark coloration of its firm, glossy foliage
- Stands out in arrangements and grows up to 6.0’ tall when kept in bright sun
- Low maintenance grower that needs only sunshine, well-draining soil, and deep, infrequent watering

Zone: 10 (30°F)

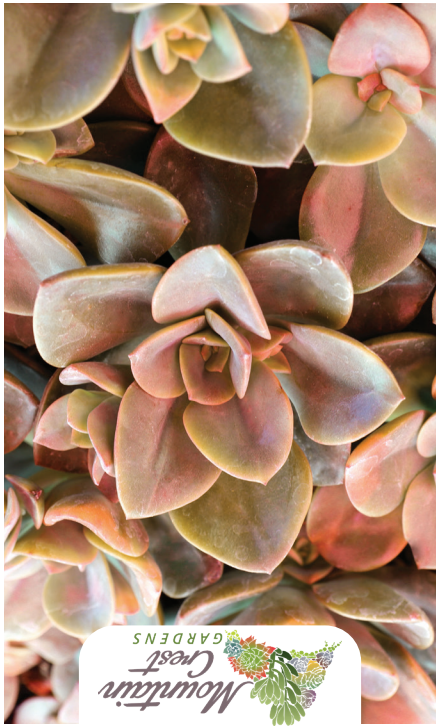
Burrito

Sedum morganianum

- Vigorous trailing variety that can grow stems up to 3’ long covered with bean-like leaves
- Naturally occurring species from Mexico, well-loved in cultivation but, as yet, undiscovered in the wild
- Quick to propagate from stem cuttings or leaves (an advantage, since its leaves fall off easily)
- Tolerates drought, full sun, and neglect, needing only great drainage and protection from frost

Zone: 10 (30°F)

Chroma

Echeveria

- **Sturdy rosette** and easy grower that thrives with lots of full, direct sun
- **Variable coloration** depending on light exposure, including purple, blue-green, and peach tones
- **Dark, glossy leaves** contrast well with other succulents and make it stand out in arrangements
- **Low maintenance grower**, needing only great drainage, protection from frost, and plenty of bright light

Zone: 10 (30°F)

Jet Beads

Sedeveria

- **Distinctively shaped succulent** with short stems covered by chunky, teardrop leaves
- **Dark coloration** of green and burgundy that deepens to near black in full sun and drought
- **Contrasts well** with most succulents in arrangements, both due to its unique form and coloration
- **Easy to propagate** from stem cuttings or fallen leaves by planting into damp, gritty soil

Zone: 10 (30°F)
